FIRE PREVENTION WEEK



WHEREAS, the City of Roanoke is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting our city; and

WHEREAS, fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

WHEREAS, home fires killed more than 2,700 people in the United States in 2022, according to the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®), and fire departments in the United States responded to 360,000 home fires; and

WHEREAS, roughly three out of five fire deaths happen in homes with either no smoke alarms or with no working smoke alarms; and

WHEREAS, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires almost in half; and

WHEREAS, smoke alarms sense smoke well before you can, alerting you to danger in the event of fire in which you may have as little as 2 minutes to escape safely; and

WHEREAS, Roanoke residents should install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home ; and

WHEREAS, Roanoke residents will make sure their smoke alarms meet the needs of all their family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities ; and

WHEREAS, residents should test smoke alarms at least once a month; and

WHEREAS, residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely to survive a fire; and

WHEREAS, Roanoke first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and

WHEREAS, Roanoke residents are responsive to public education measures and are able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and

WHEREAS, the 2024 Fire Prevention Week™ theme, "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you.™," serves to remind us the importance of having working smoke alarms in the home.

THEREFORE, I Carl E. Gierisch, Jr., Mayor of the City of Roanoke do hereby proclaim

October 6-12, 2024

as Fire Prevention Week throughout this city, and I urge all the people of Roanoke to make sure their homes have working smoke alarms and to support the many public safety activities and efforts of Roanoke's fire and emergency services.

Troy Dunn, Councilmember, Haltom City

Troy Dunn and his wife own Troy Dunn Insurance Agency, which is very active in the community. Dunn is a member of the Birdville Education Foundation Board of Directors, served on the 2022 Birdville ISD Bond Committee, and has been offering a Troy Dunn Insurance Scholarship for Haltom High seniors for six years. He is very active in his community and is the Northeast Tarrant Chamber incoming chair and a Haltom City Council councilmember. He previously served on the Haltom City Economic Development Corporation for three years, the Zoning Board of Adjustments for three years, and the Parks Board for five years. Dunn is a community partner with Haltom Senior Center Bingo each month and has been a luncheon sponsor at the Center for the past four years. Kim Greaves, Mayor, Westlake
